The UK: an active player in Horizon 2020

- UK organisations secured nearly 12% of all funds totalling more than €7.5 billion. The UK is the second highest recipient of grant funding after Germany.
- The UK has the highest number of participations in the European Research Council (ERC) and Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions (MSCA).
- The UK is a top five collaboration partner for 25 of the 27 EU countries.
- The UK holds a coordinator role in over 5,200 projects the highest of all participating countries.
- The overall UK success rate (14.8%) is higher than the EU average (14.1%).

UK participation in Horizon Europe

On 24 December 2020, the negotiations on the UK-EU Trade and Cooperation Agreement concluded

The <u>announcement</u> confirmed that the UK will associate to Horizon Europe

This includes full participation in the programme (with the exception of the EIC Fund)

UK entities can participate in/coordinate projects and receive funding from Horizon Europe





UK association

To be finalised through adoption of the Joint Protocol

Joint Protocol (forms part of the TCA) – ready to be adopted

Protocol also includes: Copernicus, Euratom, ITER





UK association

European Commission's Q&A confirms UK eligibility:

- Full rights to participate in first Horizon Europe calls
- Full association including the European Innovation Council: EIC Fund is a part of the EIC Accelerator
- Same rights as EU partners as Associated Country

UK contribution: operational (GDP based) + participation fee







Other EU programmes?

UK Association to Horizon Europe, Euratom, Copernicus, ITER

The UK will be considered a third country for all other EU programmes:

- If legal basis allows for third country participation, UK organisations may participate (needs to be confirmed in call documents/eligibility)
- In most cases participation possible but without receiving EU funding



How about student mobility – Erasmus+?

UK has decided not to associate to the Erasmus+ programme

Will be considered a non-associated Third Country or 'Partner Country'.

The <u>new Turing scheme</u>, starting in September 2021, will provide similar mobility opportunities for UK students to study and work abroad (but not vice-versa).

Opportunities for third country participation in Erasmus+ include for example:

- Key action 1 funding can be allocated for mobility to Partner Countries
- Key action 2: several projects allow third country participation (not lead, needs to demonstrate added value)
- Erasmus Mundus
