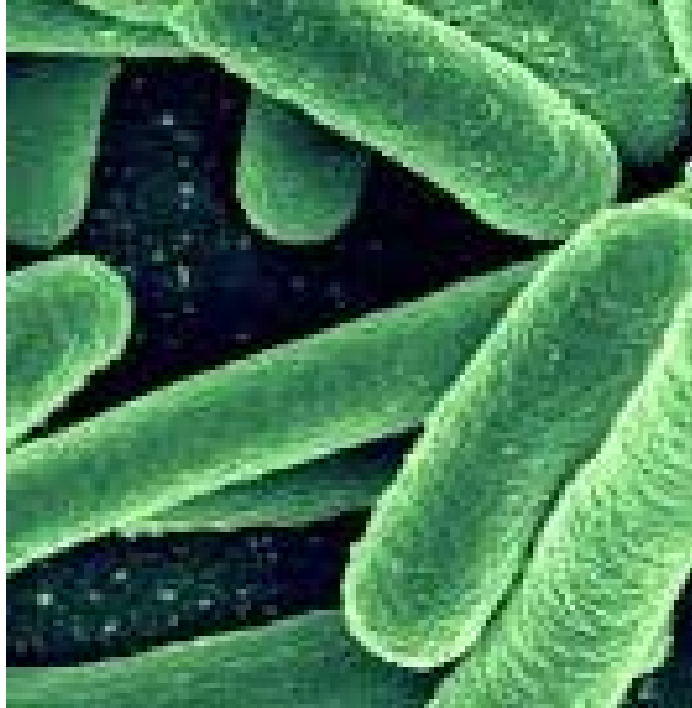

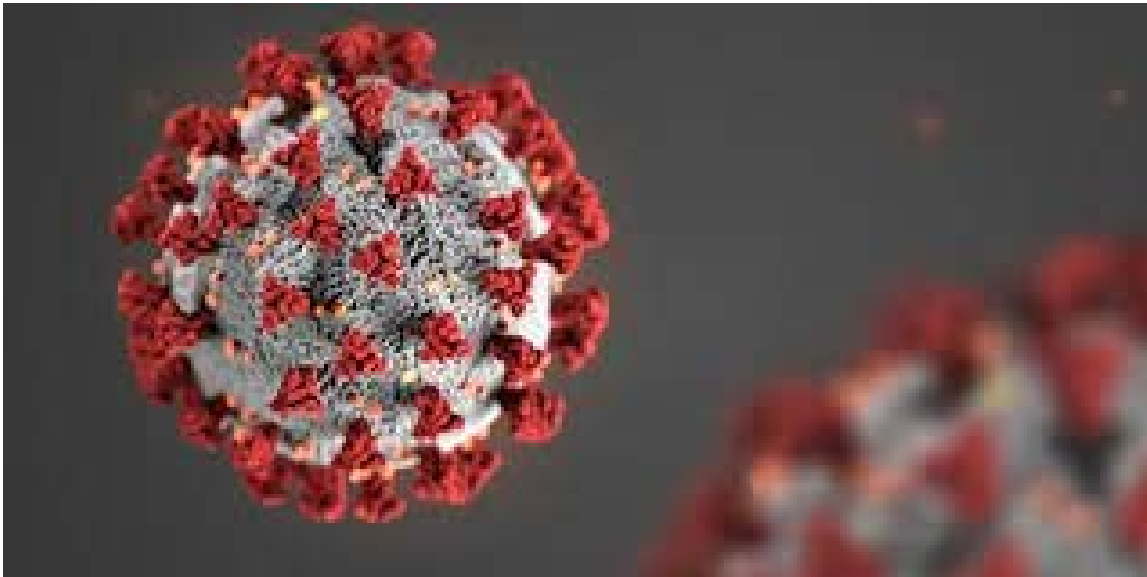




Response mode funding with International Co-Investigators

- Costs for work undertaken at an overseas organisation are admissible and should be discussed with the programme manager before submission of the application
- Costs attributed to international co-investigators (Co-Is) from developed countries not on the OECD DAC list, India or China must not exceed 30% of the FEC grant value. There is no cap on eligible funds going to international Co-Is from DAC list countries.
- More than one International Co-I may be included on the proposal as long as the combined funding requested for international Co-Is does not exceed the caps stated.
- 100% of the direct costs will be paid to the international co-investigator for both DAC list and developed countries.
