Mission Restore our Ocean and Waters by 2030: objectives and targets

PROTECT AND RESTORE MARINE AND FRESHWATERS ECOSYSTEMS AND BIODIVERSITY

- Protect at least 30% and strictly protect 10% EU's sea areas
- Restore 25.000 km free flowing rivers
- Marine nature restoration targets (incl. degraded seabeds, coastal ecosystems)

PREVENT AND ELIMINATE POLLUTION OF OUR OCEANS, SEAS AND WATERS

- Reduce by at least 50% plastic litter
- Reduce by at least 30% microplastics
- Reduce by at least 50% nutrient losses, chemical pesticides

Make the blue economy carbonneutral and circular

- Net zero maritime emissions
- Zero carbon aquaculture,
- Low carbon multipurpose use of marine space

Rebuilding the habitats that support our climate

FutureMARES

Climate change alters natural habitats, which in turn can accelerate climate change. To break this cycle, researchers are turning their sights to nature-based solutions, and especially to restore "habitat-forming" species on which ecosystems depend. In the case of our oceans and estuaries, that means species like saltmarsh plants, seagrass, kelp, corals and mangroves. The FutureMARES project researched ways to restore these habitats so that they continue to protect us from erosion and flooding, soak up carbon, provide safe breeding grounds for fisheries, and support tourism and cultural heritage.



Our oceans need to be restored, not just preserved

MERCES

After decades of human-driven degradation, it's time to restore the world's marine ecosystems. This is the ambition of the MERCES project, a wideranging exploration of the technology, management, economics and legal aspects that will help us improve the state of our oceans in the face of climate change. As well as altering our lifestyles, the researchers say, we need to actively repair damage to marine habitats, from estuaries to the deep ocean. The science, structures and human relationships developed as part of the project will help the world to do that in the coming decades.

Young citizen scientists track plastic pollution

Plastic Pirates

Plastic pollution is a menace to our seas and inland waterways. But what kinds of plastic? Where is the problem worst? Young Europeans are helping to answer these important questions through the citizen science project Plastic Pirates – Go Europe! Schools and youth groups collect plastic samples from streams and rivers and record their results. Scientists then analyse the data and use it to create pollution maps. Plastic Pirates began during the pandemic under the Trio Presidency of Germany, Portugal and Slovenia. In 2022 it became a pan-European initiative with EU funding.
