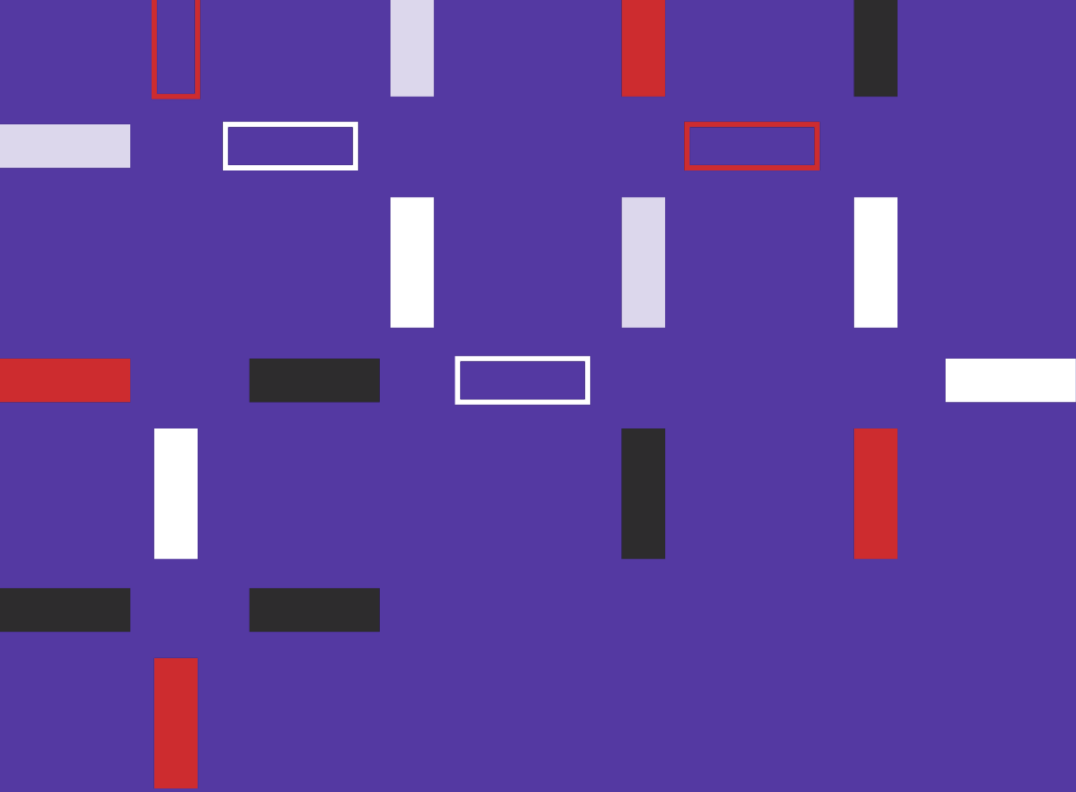


Access to equity - Investment





- The **evaluation process** is managed by **EISMEA**.
- All proposals submitted in response to EIC Accelerator calls for proposals are first collected in the **Funding & Tenders Portal** and checked against the admissibility and eligibility criteria (Annexes 2&3, EIC Work Programme 2023).
- If **admissibility** ✓ **eligibility** ✓  evaluation.



EIC Accelerator application process



Criteria such as:

- **When:** respect the call deadline
- **How:** electronically via dedicated portal (EU Funding and Tender portal)
- **What:** complete, readable application in provided templates
- **Attention:** concurrent submission/implementation

EIC Accelerator – Eligibility -> who can apply?



- **Single company** (i.e. no consortia, but subcontracting and affiliated entities possible).
- **SME** according to EU definition: < 250 employees, < €50 million turnover or < €43 million total balance sheet, data from linked or partner enterprises might need to be taken into account.
- **Small mid-caps** (up to 499 employees) – for rapid scale-up only.
- **Natural person(s) or legal entity:**
 - from Member State (MS) or Associated Country (AC) intending to establish an SME or small mid-cap in MS or AC by the time of signing the EIC Accelerator contract.
 - From a non-associated third country intending to establish an SME or to relocate an existing SME to a MS or AC (establishment prior to full proposal!)

EIC Accelerator – Eligibility -> activities



- Eligible activities are the ones described in the call conditions.
- Projects must **focus on civil applications** and must not be involved in sensitive activities, such as human cloning, etc.
- Ethics principles (research integrity standards, but also EU, national and international law): ethics self-assessment.
- Do Not Significant Harm (DNSH) principle.
- Trustworthy Artificial Intelligence.
- Security screening - EU classified and sensitive information.
- Etc.

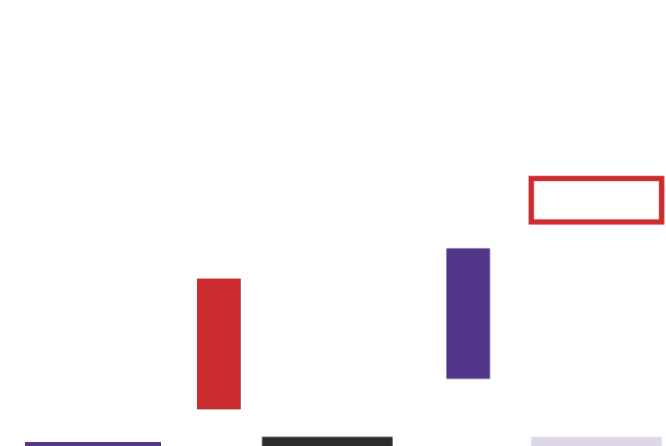

EIC Accelerator Open



to support **projects in any field** of science, technology or application without predefined thematic priorities ('bottom-up')

EIC Accelerator Challenges*

* Under the WP 2023



to support projects within **predefined thematic areas** with the aim to achieve specific objectives for each Challenge

- Novel **biomarker**-based assays to guide personalised **cancer treatment**
- **Aerosol** and **surface decontamination** for pandemic management
- **Energy storage**
- New European **Bauhaus/Architecture**, Engineering & Construction digitalisation for decarbonisation
- Emerging **semiconductor** or **quantum** technology components
- Novel technologies for **resilient agriculture**
- Customer-driven, innovative **space technologies** and services



EIC Accelerator evaluation process

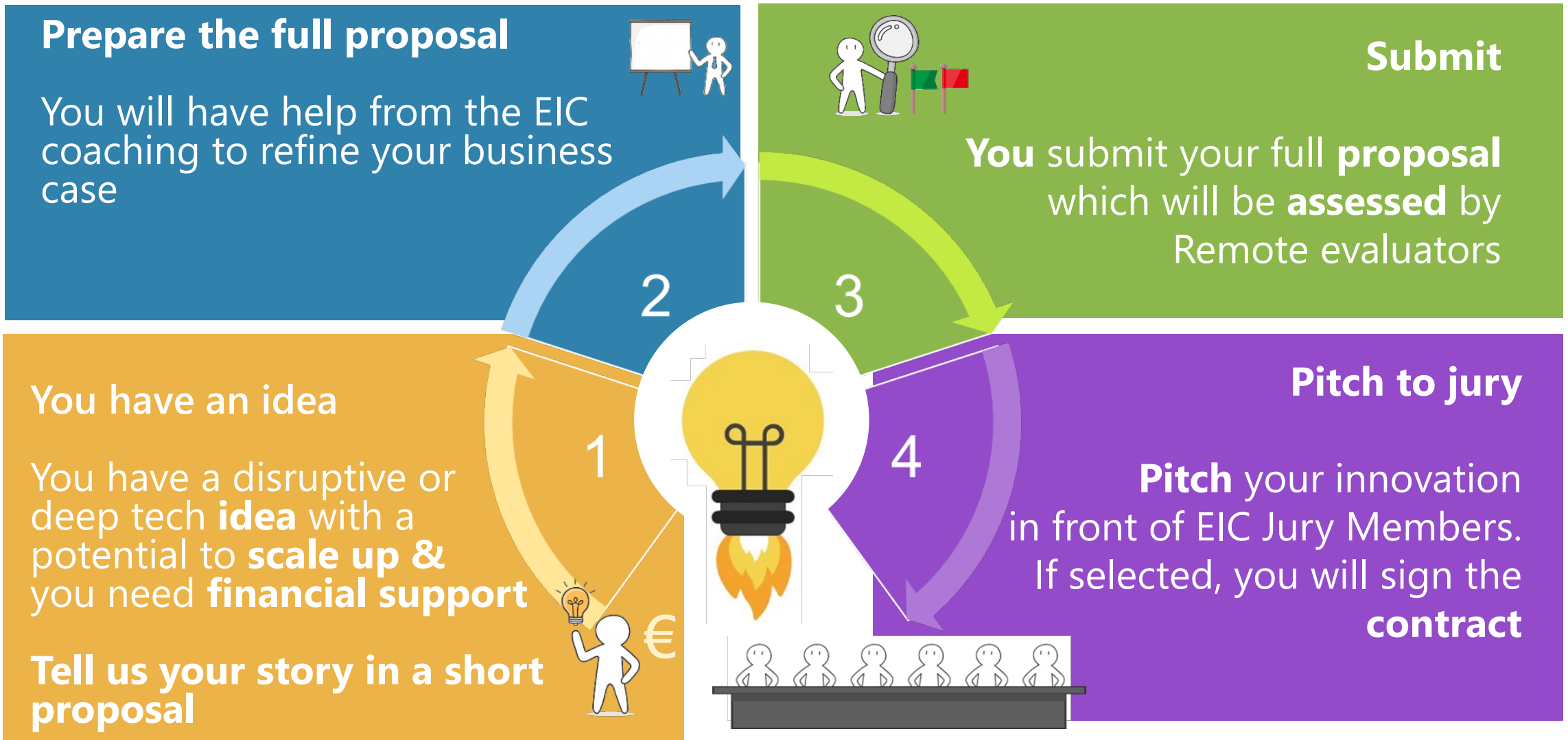




- **Excellence - Breakthrough and market creating nature**
- **Impact - Scale up potential**
- **Level of risk, implementation, and need for Union support - Team**
 - **Risk level of the investment:** Does the nature and level of risk of the investment in your innovation mean that European market actors are unwilling to commit the full amount alone? Is there evidence that market actors would be willing to invest, either alongside the EIC or at a later stage?

Evaluation in 4 steps:



Short application: your idea



Short Proposal

- Respond to a set of questions - 5 pages
- Submit a 10-slides presentation
- Submit a 3-minute video pitch (motivation)
- To be assessed by 4 EIC expert evaluators (min 2 GOs)

Full proposal: your business plan



12 months within receiving outcome
of short proposal evaluation

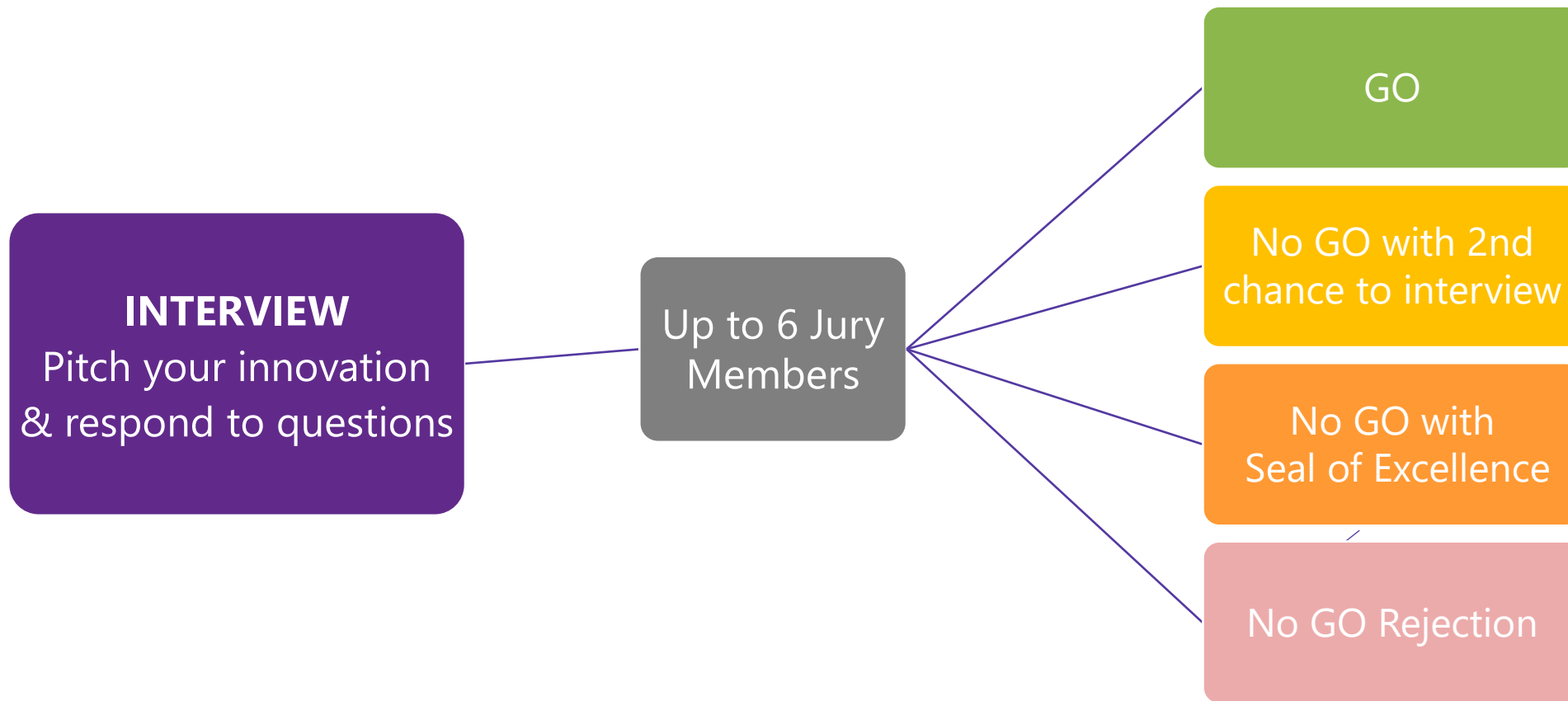
- Prepare a business plan, incl. information on your company's finances and structure (**help of an EIC business coach to refine your business case*)
- Submit your full proposal
- To be assessed by 3 EIC experts:
 - 3 GOs (i.e. 9 GOs for each award criteria)-> EIC jury
 - 2 GOs -> no EIC jury, but you may resubmit improved proposal
 - If already a resubmission -> 8 Gos -> 4th expert

Interview: pitch your innovation



- →8-9 weeks after the cut-off date.
- Pitch your innovation to the EIC Jury Members composed of serial entrepreneurs, innovation specialists and senior investors.
- Answer the questions from the EIC Jury Members.
- EIC PMs and EIB as Investment Advisor to the EIC Fund may participate.
- If selected, preparation process is launched before signing the Grant Agreement.

Full proposal: interview evaluation outcomes



Award criteria - EIC Accelerator Open and Challenges



1. EXCELLENCE

- High degree of novelty with potential to create or transform the markets
- Timing of innovation -> market, user, societal or scientific trends
- Technological feasibility – your tech has been tested in relevant env. (at least TRL5/6)
- IP – do you have rights to operate?

2. IMPACT

- Scale up potential
- Broader societal, economic, environmental or climate impacts?
- Market fit and competitor analysis
- Commercialisation strategy
- Key partners

3. Level of risk, implementation, and need for Union support

- Team
- Clear implementation plan
- Risk level of the investment
- Risk mitigation plan





EIC Accelerator

Preparation of the Grant Agreement

Steps after the selection



- Kick off meeting with the respective officers from EISMEA (Grant component) and EIB (Investment Component).
- Fine tuning of the Business Plan (Milestones, Work Packages, Deliverables etc.) for integrating jury recommendations (if any).
- Providing the requested documentation to the Validation Services.
- KYC and Tech DD initiation.

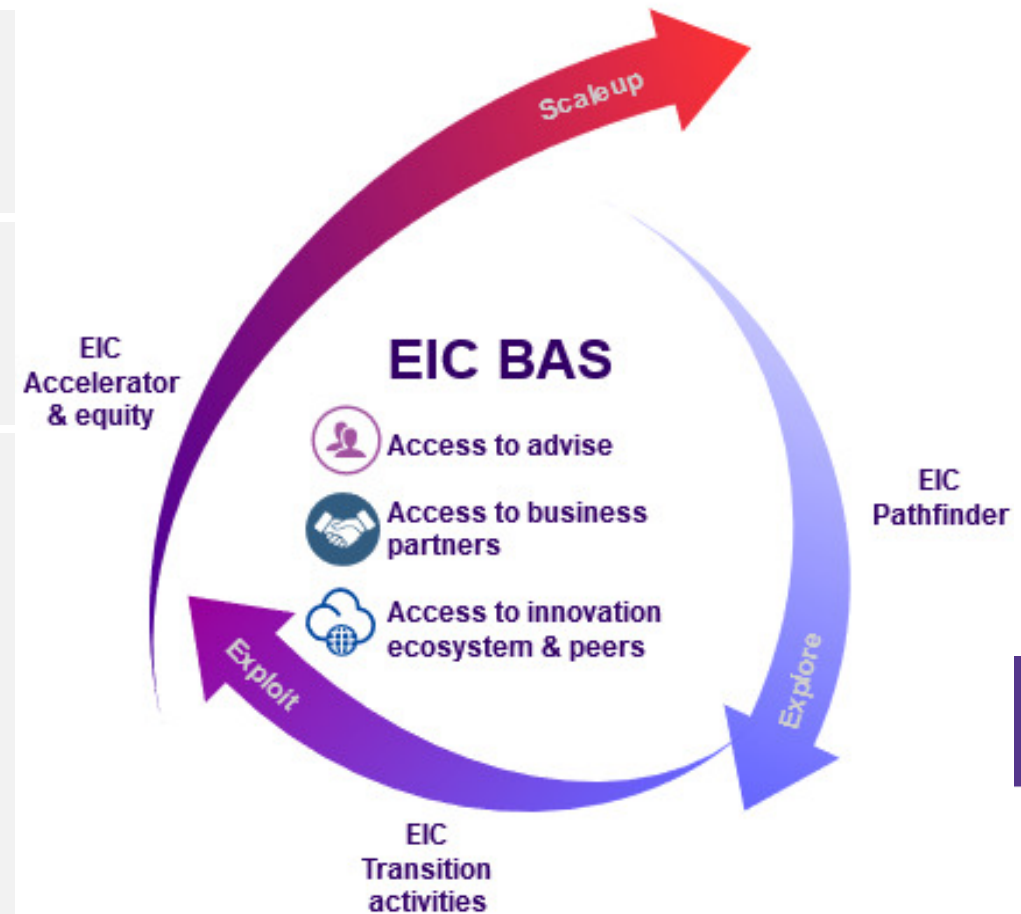
